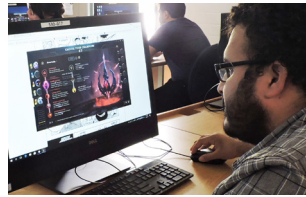
BACKGROUND

Grossmont College has been a vital part of the community since classes first convened in 1961. One out of every three East County adults has taken classes at Grossmont or Cuyamaca colleges.

Grossmont College serves a diverse learning community of students, primarily from suburban locations in East San Diego County, and also from city of San Diego neighborhoods, surrounding communities, as well as locations across the state, the nation and more than 50 countries throughout the world.

OVERVIEW

The larger campus in the two-college Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District, Grossmont College currently serves almost 19,000 full- and part-time students. Expanded and improved facilities include Griffin Center, the campus' student center; the Student and Administrative Services Building; Learning and Technology Resource Center; a Science Laboratory Building; a Digital Arts and Sculpture Building Complex; an Exercise Science and Wellness Complex, and a Health and Sciences Complex.

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT

Grossmont College is committed to serving students and providing a valuable resource for the community. Some highlights:

- Cultural and arts activities include a symphony orchestra, master chorale and performing arts programs in theater and dance. The guitar program is among the largest of California community colleges.
- The Allied Health and Nursing Division offers state-of-the-art facilities featuring 17 human patient simulators. The simulation lab and ICU unit are equipped with digital video and audio to record student performance and enhance a graduate's workforce readiness.
- Grossmont College has a partnership with Point Loma Nazarene University to offer bachelor's degrees in Nursing and Computer Information Technology with classes taught at the Grossmont College campus.
